### **Finances**

Total assets are \$1,595,256 and total liabilities are \$11,242. Income was \$527,130 and expenses were \$379,514. Loss on value of investments was \$12,894. Depreciation expense was \$58,359. Lehigh County provided \$255,720. PPP Loan of \$63,648 (which was later forgiven), \$25,647 from Investment Income, Allentown provided \$15,000 and Mayor Ray O'Connell donated \$8,000 through his annual charity golf tournament. Other municipalities donated \$14,950. Fees for programs brought in \$57,221. Membership dues raised \$7,435. Harry C. Trexler Trust donated \$25,000. United Way provided \$21,324 for food delivery and fall prevention.

**Covid 19 Pandemic** 

Covid19 infections began to recede in the Lehigh Valley in late spring 2021. The Board of Directors decided to reopen on July 1, 2021, after having been closed since March 13, 2020.

Masks for those unvaccinated were required, everyone else could wear one or not. Given that our most popular programs involved playing music, singing, eating lunch or exercise, mandating a mask would have made it unworkable.

Although we learned that a couple of people who got Covid 19 had recently been at LVAL, there were no known transmissions that occurred here. This was probably due,in part, to our air purification systems and that most participants were vaccinated.
